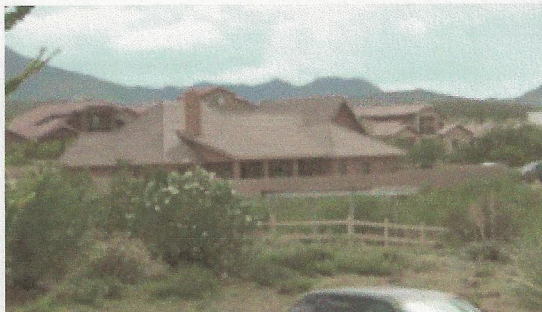

### IMPORTANT HEADLINES!

#### REZONING DATE CHANGED AND POWERLINE DISCUSSIONS



Proposed plan is for primarily 1 acre lots which is similar to picture shown. Sustainability Plan only suggests/encourages use of water conserving features - few elements are required. Swimming pools are allowed in addition to a community pool. 371 homes equates to 3,751 vehicular trips added per day to road system.

#### J-6 REZONING

##### DATE CHANGED TO OCT. 25TH

The Board of Supervisors hearing originally scheduled for October 11th has been changed to Oct. 25 due to issues with posting the legal notice.

#### SOUTHLINE UPGRADE

##### COMMUNITY MEETING BEING SCHEDULED (Late Oct.-Beg. Nov.)

The powerlines passing thru Mescal-J6 business and residential area are part of a proposed 355-mile electric transmission line project that will include development of new lines and improvements to existing lines.

The meeting in our area will be one of several that the project sponsor is holding to gather public input prior to the formal Federal environmental review process that will begin later this fall.

- a) a new 225-mile, 345 kilovolt double-circuit transmission line between the existing substations at Afton (NM) and Apache (AZ)
- b) a series of improvements to approximately 130 miles of existing transmission lines between the Apache(AZ) and Saguaro(AZ) substations.

At a recent meeting in Tucson, it was made very clear that this smaller project is not a replacement for the larger Sunzia Project - it is possible for both to be developed through the I-10 corridor.

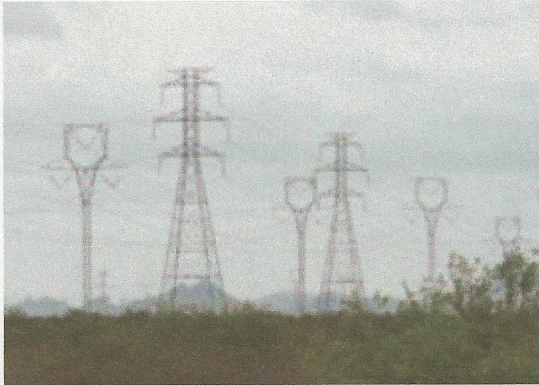


## **OBAMA FAST TRACKS SUNZIA POWER LINES!**

### **WILL LOCAL INPUT MAKE ANY DIFFERENCE?**

Obama announces administration will accelerate the permitting and construction of seven proposed electric transmission lines.

The administration's recently formed Rapid Response Team for Transmission (RRTT) will accelerate responsible and informed deployment of seven transmission facilities.



### **SunZia Transmission, LLC to bring power to New Mexico and Arizona:**

SunZia Transmission, LLC plans to construct and operate up to two 500 kV transmission lines originating at a new substation in Lincoln County in the vicinity of Ancho, New Mexico, and terminating at the Pinal Central Substation in Pinal County near Coolidge, Arizona. One of the proposed routes for these towering giants is along the I-10 corridor and our communities.
